Hawaiian words/ phrases	Definition	Class use for consistency
Linapoepoe	Circle	
"e linapoepoe kākou"	Let's make a circle, let's come to circle	
"hāpai i kou lima"	Raise your hand	
"pelu ka wāwae"	Fold your legs	
"nānā ka maka"	See with your eyes	
"ho'olohe ka pepeiao"	The ears hear	
"pa'a ka waha"	Keep your mouth closed	
"pa'a ka lima"	Fold your hands	
"ma ka uha"	In your lap	
"noho pono"	Sit appropriately	
Aloha kakahiaka	Good morning	
Peahi lima	Wave your hand	
Mino'aka	Smile	
Honi	Kiss	
Puliki	Hug	
Kunou	Bow	
Maika'i	Good	
"hō'ike mai"	Show me	
"e no'ono'o i ka ha'awina āu e mālama ai i kēia lā"	Think of a job/work you'd like to work with today	
"ke mākaukau, e hāpai i ka lima"	When you are ready, raise your hand	
eō	Yes (as a response to someone calling you)	
'ae	yes	
'a'ole	No	
Kōkua	Help, to help	
Aloha	Hello, good bye Love, care for	
"aloha kekahi i kekahi" When disciplining children, or if you are unsure of when you should interveve consider this: is their behavior or words are actions or words of <i>aloha</i> , or if they promote <i>aloha kekahi i kekahi</i> .	Love one another Care for one another	"Is that (word/action) aloha? Then, you should not say/do that. Your (hand/mouth/etc.) was made to aloha kekahi i kekahi."
Kuleana	Responsibility, duty	
Mālama	To care for	
"mālama kekahi i kekahi"	Care for one another (same as aloha)
