Hōkūpa'a is a fixed star. Hōkūhele is a

traveling star. Traveling stars are known as planets. Planets have roads called ala or orbit.

The wise men follow a faith of light. A conjunction of a hōkūpa'a and a hōkūhele. A dance in space between Jupiter and Regulus. Prograde is moving east to west. Retrograde is moving west to east.

The Three Kings come from a place called Persia, which broke up into Iraq and Iran. It used to be its own country, which was called Orient and had a large area. In 539 BC, the Persian empire was created by Cyrus the Great, who also seized Babylon. The Persians built castles for their royalty, and their empire lasted for 200 years. At some point in this era, the Persian empire was divided into 20 provinces. This was because the empire was such a colossal empire. Answers to ridiculous questions can be impossible events. Jupiter has so many conjunctions because it is the largest planet in the solar system. It's impossible for

Jupiter to go into retrograde without a large object hitting it. On the playground today we demonstrated how planets move. When we were in the circle, Isabel was Jupiter and she didn't change direction unless an object bigger than her got close to her. When they saw Jupiter and Regulus in conjunction, they said," We gotta move!" And left because they knew Jesus would be born.
