









KAWAIAHA'O CHURCH SCHOOL KULA KAUWELA 2022

This summer's theme will focus on the many different Ecosystems of Hawai'i from the mountains cloud forest, rain forest, mesic forest and dry forest to the ocean and coral reefs. How a healthy relationship between all these ecosystems is important for both people and animals, based on curriculum from Kamehameha Publishing. The program will include hands on activities; an integrated S.T.E.A.M. curriculum related to our home in Hawai'i.

Kawaiaha'o Church School's Summer Program is a great way to continue to give keiki exposure to 'ōlelo Hawai'i (Hawaiian language), teach keiki about unique plants and wildlife native to Hawai'i, and to share Hawaiian culture and values. Keiki will be learning in an indoor-outdoor classroom environment.

Summer Session Dates:

This year, we are offering two Summer Sessions. You may choose to enroll your keiki in either one or both sessions. In order to qualify for the Elementary Summer School program, your keiki must be 5 years old by July 31st and entering Kindergarten in the next school year.

Summer Session 1 for both Primary and Elementary Students: June 1 - 30, 2022

Summer Session 2 for both Primary and Elementary Students: July 1 - 29, 2022

Meals:

Snacks are included in the Summer School tuition, but lunches are not included. The school provides a morning snack and afternoon snack. You may bring home lunches or order lunches through our catering service. If you are providing home lunch, please pack your child's lunch in a small cooler or insulated lunch bag. Drop-off and Pickup:

- Drop-off and pick-ups will be through our morning and afternoon auto-line, which is considered the best health and safety practice.
- We are continuing curbside auto-line between 7:00-8:00am in the morning and 2:00-2:30pm in the afternoon; pickup after 2:30pm will incur a late charge of \$1.00 per minute. We ask all of our keiki to come to school by 8am and we will be monitoring the flow of traffic and effectiveness of the drop-off and pick-up procedures and adjust if needed.
 - At auto-line, a staff member will greet and help your keiki out of the vehicle along with their school belongings.
- We ask that you please remain in your vehicle wearing a mask to ensure we can keep auto line flowing efficiently.
- We ask that whenever possible, the pickup and drop off person are the same person. We strongly recommend that the designated pickup/drop off person be a family member that is not in the immune-compromised category in case there is any exposure to COVID-19 or other viruses. However, we know in some cases this cannot be avoided, and we will leave this up to each individual family to decide.
- If you are walking your keiki to school, you may drop them off at the designated auto-line area.
- We ask that parent/guardians wear facemasks when they are participating in auto-line whether they are in a vehicle or walking, and to practice 6-foot social distancing with non-family/household members.
- We ask all keiki's to wear a facemask during auto-line and throughout the school day.

Primary School Supply List: (Please bring the following items on the first day of each session)

- 1 roll of paper towels per session
- 1 container of Clorox/Disinfectant wipes, or one bottle of disinfectant spray per session
- 1 apron or large t-shirt
- 1 complete change of clothes & extra mask in a ziploc bag labeled with keiki's name (to be kept in keiki's cubby)
- 1 sleeping mat
- 1 fitted crib sheet for nap (taken home every Friday to be washed and returned on Monday)
- Covered shoes for walks
- School supply box of crayons, glue, glue stick, color markers, color pencils, and child scissors (labeled with their name)

Elementary K-6 School Supply List: (Please bring the following items on the first day of each session)

- 1 roll of paper towels per session
- 1 container/pkg of Clorox/Disinfectant wipes, or (1) bottle of disinfectant spray per session

- 1 complete change of clothes & extra mask in a ziploc bag labeled with keiki's name (to be kept in keiki's cubby)
- 1 Covered shoe for walks (optional for play structure)
- School supply box of crayons, glue, glue stick, color markers, color pencils, and child scissors (labeled with their name)

Other Summer Session Quick Facts:

- We will not be having huaka'i/field trips during the Summer Sessions so we can keep our 'ohana bubbles separate
- We will not be allowing visitors on campus during school hours to lessen the spread of germs
- We will require a signed health and safety policy at the start of summer session so please check your keiki for signs of illness or fever over 99.9 degrees each morning; we ask that you please keep sick keiki at home
